Name of Activity	Civics: house rules (from senses to cohabitation rules)
Language(s)	Italian or others
Suggested Level	FromA1
Suggested Objectives	 Drafting a set of shared house rules to live together civilly Experiencing group work as an experience of conflict management and inclusion Improving communication skills Improving listening comprehension Improving knowledge of specific lexis and basic linguistic structures to be used in a context of civil cohabitation Increasing self-confidence
Procedure	Dividing students into pairs or small groups
	Providing pictures to be shown to each pair/group: pictures represent situations related to the five senses which may occur in blocks of flats. (e.g. rubbish, noisy people). In different phases each pair/group receives a different picture which relates to the same sense.
	Activity 1 (Cause and effect/ subjectivity)
	a)Students in each pair/group elicit the lexis necessary to describe their picture. They are then invited to use the lexis in linguistic structures (which can also be very simple, e.g. there is/are).
	b)Students, within each pair/group, share feelings linked to the 5 senses that the pictures make them imagine or think of (they can use simple lexis and structures, e.g. good smell/bad smell; beautiful to see/ugly to see; nice sound/noise; painful/pleasant; I like it, I don't like it, I don't mind it).
	c)Students write down notes to describe of the picture (what, who, where which room/part of the house, when, what time, activity represented) and their related feelings.
	Activity 2
	Sharing orally, with the rest of the class, what elicited in Activity 1. Pictures and descriptions are collected and stuck on a poster after each brief presentation.
	Providing several cards with drawings representing the five senses (nose, ear, eye, hand, tongue) to each pair/group.







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	Activity 3
	Each pair/group sticks the selected "senses" cards next to the pictures and descriptions analyzed and collected on the poster in the previous activities
	Activity 4 (Social behaviour)
	Writing collectively a set of rules in order to respect everybody's feelings when living in a condominium. The linguistic structures to be used should be simple in order to be understood by everybody (You can/can't; You must/mustn't; It is necessary to; Imperative forms; from to).
	Optional : sharing ideas about what to do if somebody does not respect the set rules.
	Activity 5 (optional)
	Role playing: imagine a situation (possibly funny) in which the set of rules might be useful.
